WHEREAS, CoCoRaHS volunteers in Colorado have also contributed to our understanding of severe weather events such as hailstorms and floods, helping to improve our preparedness and response to these events; and

WHEREAS, CoCoRaHS celebrates its 25th anniversary in 2023, marking a significant milestone for the organization and its volunteers;
